1	Uneven and wet floors and steps: Slips, trips and falls	Students accompanied by visiting adults	3	2	6	Annual safety inspections and six monthly reviews carried out. Any publically accessible area undergoing cleaning, maintenance or other activity likely to cause risk is cordoned off and appropriate signage used. All school groups are pre - booked and SEN children and children with mobility issues identified to Front of House and public engagement staff. All groups met by a member of staff and are told not to run or climb in the building and given information about safe evacuation procedures Front of House staff monitor all visitor behaviour All visiting groups are accompanied by supervising adults. A ratio of 1 responsible adult to supervise a maximum of 10 students under the age of 12 is required. Older students may be supervised by fewer adults at the discretion of the public engagement staff. Children with mobility issues are accompanied by supervising adults on the upper galleries to assist in case of evacuation. The lift has additional alternative power supply in case of power failure and emergency stair evacuation chairs are installed. Staff are trained in their use on the upper levels. Students using the toilets are effectively supervised by visiting adults. Any access to areas outside of general public accessibility to be supervised by a member of public engagement staff and adhere to health and safety guidelines of Collections Managers and the Facilities Manager. The required number of trained First Aiders are on site during any visit. A suitably stocked first aid kit is kept at reception. All accidents and incidents are reported to Front of House and entered into the incident book. These are fully investigated, reported and any suitable remedial actions taken to ameliorate further risk.	2	2	4	
2	Glass cases and shap objetscs: cuts	Students accompanied by visiting adults	2	4	8	Any specimens in glass containers used in schools sessions are only handled by public engagement staff. If breakages occur a member of staff cordons off the area and disposes of the potentially hazardous material.	1	4	4
